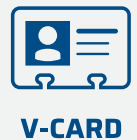

Brian Beltran attended Long Beach State University, graduating with a Bachelor of Science degree in criminal justice, with an emphasis in law enforcement. He then attended Loyola Law School, graduating with the degree of Juris Doctor. While at Loyola Law School, Brian was initially a staff writer, and then selected Technical Editor of the Loyola of Los Angeles Entertainment Law Journal, now known at the Loyola of Los Angeles Entertainment Law Review.

He also worked for the Legal Aid Society of Orange County, providing legal services, under the supervision of an attorney, to low income individuals.

After law school, Brian worked briefly for a medical malpractice defense firm, and then for a well-known personal injury firm. Subsequently, he began working for a national workers' compensation defense firm, being named a partner in that firm in 2009. In 2013, he was elevated to the level of co-managing partner for that same firm.

His practice includes all aspects of claims within workers' compensation, including the defense of serious and willful claims, and claims brought pursuant to Labor Code 132a.
